This is how we indicate that under a certain condition (as expressed in the ifclause), a specific result will likely happen in the future. FORM: In this type of mixed conditional sentence, the tense in the 'if' clause is the past perfect, and the tense in the main clause is the present conditional. This type of mixed conditional refers to an unreal past condition and its probable result in the present. These sentences express a situation which is contrary to reality both in the past and in the present. In these mixed conditional sentences, the time is the past in the "if" clause and in the present in the main clause.

Example: If you had come with us last night, you would have enjoyed the dance.

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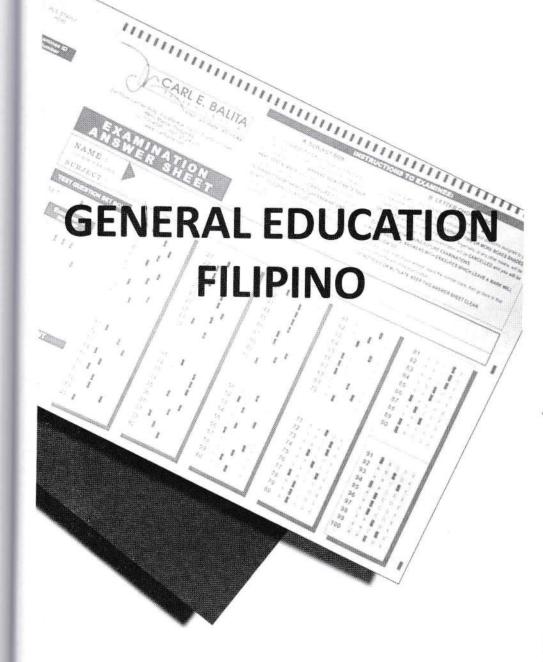

Rationale: Five S represents a strategy to develop and maintain a working environment that is clean and organized. Such an environment almost guarantees a better working environment for workers, a more organized system for tools and equipment, and a safer work environment.

Sort: This demands that any item that is not bolted down to the shop floor or welded to one of our trucks be identified. It means that each item is identified and clearly tagged. The tag can be small and attached by string, small chain, or affixed like a sticker.

The information on the tag clearly states what the item is, what its part number is, and even what the purpose for the item is. It is also very helpful if the tag states where the item is to be kept when not in use. Often the tags on items are a color easy to spot.

Set in Order: This suggests that once items are tagged that they are then segregated into a predetermined area where the items can be easily kept and found. Setting tagged items in order is no different than purchasing a "shadow box" for hand tools such as screwdrivers, hammers, wrenches, etc.

Once all items are set in order it is wise to create a "map" of the area so that anyone looking for or returning a tool can easily recognize where a tool is to be found or returned.

Shine: The third S refers to cleaning. For contractors this means the cleaning of all tools, equipment, and vehicles. It should also mean that a crew leaves a jobsite at least as clean, if not cleaner, as how they found the jobsite.

Standardize: The fourth S demands that we formalize our effort to tag items, to determine an ordering process for placement of tools, equipment, and even vehicles.

This requires that we develop standard operating procedures where helpful to educate all workers on how we take care of tools, equipment, and vehicles.

Standardizing even our cleaning efforts will help develop our workers into alert employees interested in becoming known as a clean company whom customers love to have performed their particular trade.

Sustain: Holding your workers accountable to maintaining the sort, set in order, and shine is at the heart of the fifth and final S.

This requires a balance of both proactive support through the creation of standard operating procedures, signs, tags, etc. and the immediate handling of those workers who fail to comply with 5S practices.

PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION FACILITATING LEARNING

- The three components of the educative process include the learner, the teacher and the school.
- Learning is a mental activity by means of which knowledge, skills, habits, attitudes
 and ideals are acquired and utilized, resulting in the progressive adaptation and
 modification of conduct and behavior.
- Behavioral Learning Theory operates on the principle of Stimulus-Response.
 Conclusions are based on observations of external manifestations of learning.
- Stimulus-Response (S-R) or Association Theory states that for every stimulus there is a corresponding response.
- Connectionism which was formulated by Edward Lee Thorndike assumes that human activities are based on the association or connection between stimulus and response.
- The three fundamental laws of learning includes: Readiness, Exercise and Effect.
- Law of Readiness states that when an individual is prepared to respond or act, allowing him to do so is satisfying, whereas preventing him would be annoying.
- Law of Exercise states that constant repetition of a response strengthens its
 connection with the stimulus, while disuse of a response weakens it.
- Law of Effect states that learning is strengthened if it results in satisfaction, but
 it is weakened if it leads to vexation or annoyance.
- Theory of Conditioning states that the process of learning consists of the
 acquisition of new ways of reacting to stimuli developed through attaching new
 stimuli to established modes of behavior.
- Classical Conditioning is based on the experiment on the reaction of the dog conducted by Ivan Pavlov.
- Principles under Classical Conditioning includes: Adhesive Principle, Excitation, Extinction, Stimulus Generalization and Spontaneous Recovery.
- According to the Adhesive Principle, a response is attached to every stimulus.
 For every stimulus, there is always a corresponding response.
- Excitation is also known as the law of acquisition. It occurs when a previously
 neutral stimulus gains the ability of eliciting the response.
- Extinction is also known as unlearning and occurs when the conditioned response
 is no longer elicited by the conditioned stimulus because the conditioned
 stimulus is frequently presented without the paired stimulus.
- Stimulus Generalization happens when the conditional response is also elicited by other stimuli similar to the conditioned stimulus.
- Spontaneous recovery happens when a conditioned response which does not appear for sometime but reoccurs without the need for further conditioning.
- Operant Conditioning is a theory based on the experiment conducted by Burrhus
 Frederick Skinner on a hungry rat.
- BF Skinner claimed that one can train an organism by presenting him a reward or punishment as a consequence of his actions.
- Feedback Principle states that an organism's responses maybe reinforced by presentation or removal.

- Social Learning Theory is based on the studies of Richard Wallace and Albert Bandura. They claimed that children's learning process involves observation and imitation.
- Cognitive Field Theory otherwise known as Field Theory describes how a person
 gains understanding of himself and his world in a situation where his self and his
 environment compose of totality of mutually interdependent, coexisting events.
- Insight Learning Theory is based on the experiment conducted by Wolfgang Kohler on the chimpanzee. He postulated that the more intelligent the organism and the more experiences he has the more capable he is of gaining higher insight.
- Gestalt Learning claims that the whole is more than the sum of its parts and the
 whole gets its meaning from its parts.
- Gestalt view learning as a change in knowledge, skills, attitudes, values or beliefs
 and may or may not have anything to do with the change in overt behavior.
- Instrumental conceptualism is the term applied to the theory of learning as
 advocated by Jerome Bruner who believed that the acquisition of whatever form
 of knowledge is always a dynamic and interactive process because the learner
 purposively participates in the process of knowledge acquisition who selects,
 structures, retains and transforms information.
- David Ausubel's theory is concerned with how individuals learn large amounts
 of meaningful material from verbal/textual presentations in a school setting.
- According to Ausubel, learning is based upon the kinds of superordinate, representational and combinatorial processes that occur during the reception of information.
- A major instructional mechanism proposed by Ausubel is the use of advance organizers. These organizers are introduced in advance of learning itself, and are also presented at a higher level of abstraction, generality and inclusiveness.
- Based on the Gagne Assumption, different types of learning exist, and that different instructional conditions are most likely to bring about these different types of learning.
- Gagne identifies five major categories of learning: verbal information, intellectual skills, cognitive strategies, motor skills and attitudes.
- Motivation is the stimulation of action toward a particular objective where previously there was little or no attraction toward that goal.
- Motivation is either intrinsic or extrinsic.
- Intrinsic motivation refers to the inherent or internal stimulus of the individual
 to learn. It is based on the natural desire of the individual to satisfy his drives and
 motives without the need for reward and punishment.
- Extrinsic motivation is based on incentives which are artificial devices employed
 to evoke attitude conducive to learning. Rewards and praises like medals, good
 grades, prizes, scholarships and the like as well as punishments are good examples
 of this form of motivation.

PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION CHILD AND ADOLESCENT DEVELOPMENT

- Organic growth consists of three elements: (1) increase in size (2) differentiation of structure and (3) alteration of form.
- Childhood is the time for a boy or girl from birth until he or she is an adult
- Adolescence is the period of transition from the childhood to adulthood.
- Adolescence is a period of change, problem age, a time to search for identity and a time of unrealism.
- The brain's ability to change from experience is known as Plasticity.
- Jean Piaget's Theory of Cognitive Development concerns the emergence and acquisition of schemata – schemes of how one perceives the world.
- Theory of Cognitive Development incudes (1) Sensorimotor (2) Pre-operational
 (3) Concrete operational and (4) Formal Operational
- Symbolic functioning is characterized by the use of mental symbols, words or
 pictures which the child uses to represent something which is not physically
 present.
- Centration is characterized by a child focusing or attending to only one aspect of a stimulus or situation.
- Intuitive thought occurs when the child is able to believe in something without knowing why he or she believes it.
- Egocentrism denotes the tendency of a child to only think from her or his own point of view.
- Inability to Conserve is the lack of perception of conservation of mass, volume and number after the original form has changed.
- Animism is when the child believes that inanimate objects have "lifelike" qualities and are capable of action.
- Seriation is the ability to arrange objects in an order according to size, shape or any other characteristic.
- Classification is the ability to name and identify sets of objects according to appearance, size or other characteristic, including the idea that one set of objects can include another.
- Decentering is when the child takes into account multiple aspects of a problem to solve it.
- Reversibility is when the child understands that numbers or objects can be changed then returned to their original state.
- Conservation is the understanding that quantity, length or number of items is unrelated to the arrangement or appearance of the object or items.
- Elimination of egocentrism is the ability to view things from another's perspective.
- Each of Erikson's stages of Psychosocial development are marked by a conflict, for which successful resolution will result in a favorable outcome.
- Forgetting is the inability to access information when needed.
- There are two main ways in which forgetting likely occurs: decay and interference.
- Decay is when information is not attended to, and eventually fades away.

- Interference is when new or old information blocks access to the information in question.
- Aphasia is a loss of the ability to produce and/or comprehend language, due to injury to brain areas specialized for these functions.
- Dyslexia is a specific learning disability that manifests primarily as a difficulty with written language, particularly with reading and spelling.
- Mental retardation is a term for a pattern of persistently slow learning of basic motor and language skills during childhood and a significantly below-normal global intellectual capacity as an adult.
- Autism is a brain development disorder characterized by impairments in social interaction and communication, and restricted and repetitive behavior, all exhibited before a child is three years old.
- Asperger's Syndrome is characterized by difficulties in social interaction and by restricted and stereotyped interests and activities.
- Down Syndrome or Trisomy 21 is a genetic disorder caused by the presence of all
 or part of an extra 21st chromosome. Individuals with Down Syndrome can have a
 lower than average cognitive ability, often ranging from mild to moderate learning
 disabilities.
- Media, parenting, role models and peer groups are some major factors affecting the social and emotional development of children and adolescents.
- Emotional intelligence describes an ability, capacity or skill to perceive, assess and manage the emotions of one's self, of others and of groups.
- Self awareness is the ability to read one's emotions and recognize their impact while using gut feelings to guide decisions.
- Self management involves controlling one's emotions and impulses and adapting to changing circumstances.
- Social awareness is the ability to sense, understand and react to other's emotions
 while comprehending social networks.
- Relationship management is the ability to inspire, influence and develop others while managing conflict.

PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT

- Curriculum is viewed as a listing of subjects to be taught in the school.
- Curriculum also refers to the total learning experience of individuals not only in schools, but in society as well.
- Subject-centered curriculum is organized on the basis of separate and distinct subjects, each of which embodies a body of knowledge and skills. The learner is expected to acquire these knowledge and skills.
- Child-centered curriculum is when the child is considered the center of the educative process.
- Problem-centered curriculum is when the child is guided toward maturity within the context of the social group. It helps the child to solve his problems.

- Franklin Bobbit presented curriculum as a science that emphasizes the student's needs.
- According to Werett Charters, the listing of objectives and matching of these
 with corresponding activities ensures that the content or subject matter is related
 to the objectives.
- William Kilpatrick claimed that the purpose of the curriculum is child development.
- To Harold Rugg, the curriculum should develop the whole child. Rugg emphasized social studies, and that teachers plan the curriculum in advance.
- Hollis Caswell saw curriculum as organized around social function or themes, organized knowledge and learner's interest. Caswell believes that curriculum is a set of experiences.
- Ralph Tyler believes that curriculum is a science and an extension of the school's philosophy. It is based on the student's needs and interest. The curriculum aims to educate generalists and not specialists.
- Recommended curriculum is proposed by scholars and professional organizations.
 The curriculum may come from a national agency like DepEd or CHED.
- Written curriculum appears in school, district, division or country documents.
 An example is the Basic Education Curriculum.
- Taught curriculum is what teachers implement or deliver in the classrooms or schools.
- Supported curriculum are resources like textbooks, computers, audio-visual materials which support and help in the implementation of the curriculum.
- Assessed curriculum is that which is tested and evaluated. At the end of the teaching episodes, series of evaluations is done by the teachers to determine the extent of learning or to tell if the students are progressing.
- Learned curriculum is what the students actually learn and what is measured.
 This refers to the learning outcomes achieved by the students.
- Hidden curriculum is the unintended curriculum. This is not deliberately planned but may modify behavior or influence learning outcomes.
- The elements or components of the curriculum include: (1) aims, goals and objectives, (2) subject matter/content, (3) learning experiences, (4) evaluation approaches
- Self-sufficiency, significance, validity, interest, utility, learnability and feasibility
 are the criteria to be considered in the selection of subject matter content or
 knowledge for the curriculum.
- According to Scheffler, the prime guiding principle for content selection is helping
 the learners to attain maximum self-sufficiency in learning, but in the most
 economical manner.
- Economy means less teaching effort and educational resources, less learner's effort but more results and effective learning outcomes.
- When the content or subject matter will contribute to basic ideas, concepts, principles and generalization to achieve the overall aims of the curriculum, then it is significant.
- Subject matter is significant if it will develop the cognitive, affective and psychomotor skills of the learners.

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- The authenticity of the subject matter selected is it validity.
- For a learner-centered curriculum, interest is the key criterion. A learner will value the content if it is meaningful to him or her.
- Utility is the usefulness of the content or subject matter.
- Learnability entails that subject matter in the curriculum should be within the range of the experiences of the learners.
- Feasibility is when the subject matter or content learned within the time allowed, available resources, expertise of the teacher and the nature of the learners.
- The overall goal of the K to 12 Curriculum is the holistic development of every Filipino learner, with 21st century skills, to be adequately prepared for work, entrepreneurship, middle-level skills development and higher education.
- Outcomes-Based Education is an approach to education in which decisions about the curriculum are driven by the exit learning outcomes that the students should display at the end of the course.
- NCBTS define good teaching through the following: (1) Domains (2) Strands (3)
- Domains are distinctive spheres of the learning process, and are also a welldefined area for demonstrating positive teacher practices.
- Strands are specific dimensions of positive teacher practices under the broad conceptual domain.
- Indicators are concrete, observable and measurable teacher behaviors, actions, habits, routines and practices known to create, facilitate and support enhanced student learning.
- The 7 Domains of the NCBTS Framework: (1) Social Regard for Learning (2) The Learning Environment (3) Diversity of Learners (4) Curriculum (5) Planning, Assessing and Reporting (6) Community Linkages (7) Personal Growth and Professional Development.

PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION ASSESSMENT OF LEARNING

- Assessment refers to the process of gathering, describing or quantifying information about student performance.
- Measurement refers to the quantitative aspect of evaluation. It involves outcomes that can be quantified statistically.
- Evaluation is the qualitative aspect of determining the outcomes of learning. It
 involves value judgement.
- Test consists of questions or exercises or other devices for measuring the outcomes of learning.
- Objective tests are tests which have definite answers and therefore are not subject to personal bias.
- Teacher-made tests or educational tests are constructed by the teachers based on the contents of different subject taught.
- Diagnostic tests are used to measure a student's strengths and weaknesses, usually to identify deficiencies in skills or performance.

- Formative testing is done to monitor student's attainment of the instructional objectives.
- Summative testing is done at the conclusion of instruction and measures the
 extent to which students have attained the desired outcomes.
- Standardized tests are already valid, reliable and objective. Standardized tests
 are tests for which contents have been selected and for which norms or standards
 have been established.
- Norm-Referenced Test is designed to measure the performance of a student compared with other students.
- The purpose of norm-referenced test is to rank each student with respect to the
 achievement of others in broad areas of knowledge and to discriminate high and
 low achievers.
- Criterion-Referenced Test is a test designed to measure the performance of students with respect to some particular criterion or standard.
- The purpose of criterion-referenced test is to determine whether each student
 has achieved specific skills or concepts and to find out how much students know
 before instruction begins and after I has finished.
- Validity is the degree to which the test measures what it intends to measure.
- A valid test is always reliable.
- Reliability refers to the consistency of scores obtained by the same person when
 retested using the same instrument or one that is parallel to it.
- Administrability requires that the test should be administered uniformly to all students so that the scores obtained will not vary due to factors other than differences of the student's knowledge and skills.
- Scorability states that the test should be easy to score. Directions for scoring should be clear.
- Appropriateness mandates that the test items that the teacher construct must assess the exact performances called for in the learning objectives.
- Adequacy states that the test should contain a wide sampling of items to determine the educational outcomes or abilities so that the resulting scores are representative of the total performance in the areas measured.
- Fairness mandates that the test should not be biased to the examinees.
- Objectivity represents the agreement of two or more raters or a test administrator concerning the score of a student.
- Nominal scales classify objects or events by assigning numbers to them.
- Ordinal scales classify and assign rank order.
- Interval scales contains the nominal and ordinal properties and is also characterized by equal units between score points.
- In ratio scales, the zero point is arbitrary.
- The table of specifications is a device describing test items of the content and the process dimensions, which is, what a student is expected to know and what he or she is expected to do with that knowledge.
- Item analysis refers to the process of examining the student's response to each item in the test.
- Difficulty index (DF) refers to the proportion of the number of students in the upper and lower groups who answered an item correctly.

- Discrimination index is the difference between the proportion of high-performing students who got the item right and the proportion of low-performing students who got an item right.
- A frequency distribution is merely a listing of the possible score values and the number of persons who achieved each score.
- Measures of Central Tendency are useful for summarizing average performance.
- The mean of a set of scores is the arithmetic average.
- The median is the point that divides the distribution in half; that is, half of the scores fall above the median and half of the scores fall below the median.
- The mode is the most frequently occurring score in the distribution.
- The Measures of Variability indicate how spread out the scores tend to be.
- The range indicates the difference between the highest and lowest scores in the distribution.
- The variance measures how widely the scores in the distribution are spread about the mean
- The standard deviation indicates how spread out the scores are, but it is expressed
 in the same units as the original scores.
- The percentile rank of a score is the percentage of the scores in the frequency distribution which are lower.
- Normal curve is a symmetrical bell-shaped curve, whose end tails are continuous and asymptotic.
- Positively skewed when the curve is skewed to the right. Most of the scores of the students are very low.
- Negatively skewed when a distribution is skewed to the left. Most of the students got a very high score.
- Rubrics is a scoring scale and instructional tool to assess the performance of student using a task-specific set of criteria.
- Portfolio assessment is the systematic, longitudinal collection of student work created in response to specific, known as instructional objectives and evaluated in relation to the same criteria.

PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION PRINCIPLES AND METHODS OF TEACHING

- The strategy of teaching refers to the science of developing a plan to attain goal and to guard against undesirable results.
- Method of Teaching refers to the series of related and progressive acts performed by a teacher and the students to attain the specific objectives of the lesson.
- Technique of Teaching refers to the personalized style of carrying out a particular step of a given method.
- The roles of teacher include: model, classroom manager, facilitator of learning, motivator, evaluator of student's performance, parent surrogate, counselor and a friend.
- Classroom management is the administration or direction of activities with special reference to problems involving discipline, democratic techniques, use of supplies and other materials, the physical features of the classroom, general housekeeping and the social relationships of the pupils and teachers.
- Questioning is the starting point of learning.

- Lesson Plan is the termed applied to the statement of objectives to be realized
 and the methods to be used in the attainment of such objectives within the
 specified time.
- A learning objective is a statement of what students will be able to do when they
 have completed instruction.
- A learning objective is a statement describing a competency or performance capability to be acquired by the learner.
- The three essential characteristics in ensuring clear statements of objectives are: behavior, criterion and conditions.
- A goal is a statement of the intended general outcome of an instructional unit or program.
- Cognitive learning domain is concerned primarily with higher education.
- The psychomotor domain refers to the use of basic motor skills, coordination and physical movement.
- Affective domain is concerned with learning of beliefs, attitude and values.
- Low-inquiry questions focus on previously learned knowledge in order to answer questions posed by the teacher, who requires the students to perform eliciting meaning of a term, supplying an example of something and providing a specific, predictable answer to a question.
- High-inquiry questions focus on previously learned knowledge in order to answer questions posed by the teacher, who requires the students to perform an abstract operation, rating some entity to its value, dependability, importance or sufficiency with a defense of the rating, finding similarities or difference and making inferences to account for the occurrence of something.
- Brainstorming is used to generate ideas. Quantity is more important than quality.
- A supervised study is a common technique used in problem solving instruction.
 This is appropriate for discovery or inquiry learning, laboratory activities and if there is a good access to reference materials.
- Pygmalion (Rosenthal) Effect refers to situations in which students performed better than other students simply because they were expected to do so.
- Technology can refer to material objects of use to humanity, such as machines or hardware, but it can also encompass broader themes, including systems, methods of organization, and techniques.
- Educational technology is the study and ethical practice of facilitating learning and improving performance by creating, using and managing appropriate technological processes and resources.
- A device is any means other than the subject matter itself that is employed by the teacher in presenting the subject matter to the learner.
- The multimedia is an audiovisual package that includes more than one instructional media, such as text, graphics, audio animation and video clip.
- Hypermedia is multimedia packaged as an education computer software, where
 information is presented and student activities are integrated in a virtual learning
 environment.
- Podcasting is a relatively new invention that allows anybody to publish files to the internet where individuals can subscribe and receive new files from people by subscription.

- An affinity diagram is used to cluster complex, apparently unrelated data into natural and meaningful groups.
- Tree Diagram is used to chart out, in increasing detail, the various tasks that must be accomplished to complete a project or achieve a specific objective.
- A fishbone diagram shows the relationship of possible causes and sub-causes directly related to and identifies its effect/problem.
- Circle or Pie graph is recommended for showing parts of whole.
- A bar graph is used in comparing the magnitude of similar items at different entities or seeing relative sizes of the parts of a whole.

PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION THE TEACHING PROFESSION

- Formal education refers to the hierarchically structured and chronologically
 graded learning organized and provided by the formal school system and for
 which certification is required in order for the learner to progress through the
 grades or move to higher levels.
- Non-formal education refers to any school-based educational activities
 undertaken by the DECS and other agencies aimed at attaining specific learning
 objectives for a particular clientele, especially the illiterates and the out-ofschool youths and adults, distinct from and outside the regular offerings of the
 formal school system.
- Informal education is a type of education which can be acquired anytime and anywhere.
- Naturalism is an educational philosophy which adheres to the belief that
 education should be in accordance with the nature of the child.
- Idealism focuses on the conscious reasoning of the mind in order to attain truth.
 This includes the activities pertinent to the human mind such as introspection and intuition and the use of logic.
- Realism is concerned with the actualities of life, what is real. Ultimate reality is
 the world of physical objects. Reality is independent of the human mind.
- In existentialism, learning is based on the willingness of the student to choose and give meaning to the subject.
- Essentialism refers to the traditional or back to the basic approach in education.
- Pragmatism stresses on the application of what have learned rather than the transfer of the organized body of knowledge.
- In perennialism truth is universal and does not depend on circumstances of place, time and person. Curriculum must be based on recurrent themes of human life for it views education as a recurring process based on eternal truths.
- According to humanism, education is a process and should not be taken abruptly.
 The unfolding of human character proceeds with the unfolding of nature.
- Progressivism focuses on the child as a whole rather than of the content or the teacher. Curriculum content comes from the questions and interests of the students.

- Nationalism emphasizes on the development of loyalty, patriotism, national feeling and responsible citizenship.
- Constructivism is a philosophy of learning which asserts that reality does not
 exist outside of human conceptions. It is the individual that construct reality by
 reflecting on his own experience and gives meaning to it.
- The primary goal of Reconstructivism is to achieve the elusive social change.
- In utilitarianism, actions are geared toward the greatest total amount of happiness that one can achieve.
- In rationalism, the source of knowledge is the mind, independent of the senses.
- Experimentalism is a form of empiricism and asserts that the only reliable form
 of knowledge is gained through scientific experiments.
- According to Hedonism, pleasure is the only good thing to a person.
- Epicurianism is considered as a form of ancient hedonism, it identifies pleasure with tranquility and reduction of desire.
- UNESCO defies global education as a goal to become aware of the educational conditions or lack of it, and aim to educate all people to certain world standards.
- The 1987 Constitution states that the state shall protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels and shall take appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all.
- RA 7722 is otherwise known as the Higher Education Act of 1994 which states that
 the state shall ensure and protect academic freedom.
- CHED is tasked by the state to identify centers of excellence in program areas needed for the development of world class scholarship, nation building and development.
- RA 7796 is known as the Technical Education Skills Development (TESDA) Act of 1994. This law provided for the creation of the TESDA.
- Batas Pambansa 232 or Education Act of 1982 states that students have the right
 to receive primarily through competent instruction, relevant quality education
 in line with national goals and conductive to their full development as person
 with the human dignity.
- Education For All (EFA) 2015 institutionalize early childhood care and development and provide universal quality primary education.
- Characteristics of a Child Friendly School System (CFSS) include: gender sensitive
 and not discriminating, child-centered, promotes good health, has the best
 interest of child in mind and works closely with children's families.
- RA 7836 is known as the Philippine Teachers Professionalization Act of 1994. This law provided for the creation of the Board of Professional Teachers composed of five (5) Commissioners appointed by the President of the Philippines upon the recommendations of the recognized and accredited association of teachers, institution of the Licensure Examination for Teachers (LET) which shall replace the Professional Board Exam for Teachers (PBET) and the transferring of authority of administering the LET from the Civil Service Commission and DECS to the Board for Professional Teachers in the Professional Regulation Commission.

- RA 4670 is the Magna Carta for Public School Teachers which ensures stability of
 employment. Teachers shall enjoy academic freedom, particularly with regard
 to teaching and classroom methods. Teachers salary at the very least will keep
 pace with the rise in the cost of living by payment of cost of living index.
- The three basic skills a professional teacher must possess are functional skills, adaptive skills and professional skills.
- Functional skills involve the skills of a teacher in planning, organizing, controlling, communicating, motivating, developing and managing.
- Adaptive skills are the skills like creativity, dependability, resourcefulness, persuasiveness, discipline, memory, perceptiveness and other personal skills related to self-management.
- Professional skills refer akin to work content. It includes the teacher's knowledge
 of the subject matter to be taught, as well as his understanding of the
 philosophical, psychological, legal, social, historical dimensions of education.
- The NCBTS is a unified framework for teacher development. It is an integrated theoretical framework that defines the different dimensions of effective teaching.

PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION SOCIAL DIMENSIONS OF EDUCATION

- The Four Pillars of Education all started with the report entitled Learning the Treasure Within of the International Commission of Education for the Twentyfirst Century, chaired by Jacques Delors in 1996.
- Learning to Know implies how to learn by developing one's concentration, memory skills and ability to think; acquiring the instrument of understanding.
- Learning to Do represents the skillful, creative and discerning application of knowledge.
- To perform a job or work, the learning to do must be fulfilled. This entails the
 acquisition of competence that enables people to deal with a variety of situations,
 and to work in teams.
- Learning to Live Together is vital in building a genuine and lasting culture of peace in the world.
- A wide range of skills is necessary for learning to live together: self-control, handling emotions, communications, interpretation of behaviors, critical thinking, relationship building and cooperation, negotiation, mediation and refusal, problem solving and decision making.
- Learning to Be refers to the role of education in developing all the dimensions of the complete person: to achieve the physical, intellectual, emotional and ethical integration of the individual into a complete man.
- Gender and Development or GAD is an approach on socially constructed basis of the difference between men and women and emphasized the need to challenge the existing gender roles and relations.
- Gender socialization is a process by which norms, roles and expectations in relation to gender are learned by men and women.

- Gender stereotype is a form of prejudgement, bias or limitation given to roles and expectations of males and females.
- The primary goal of Multicultural education is to transform the school so that
 male and female students, exceptional students, and students from diverse
 cultural, social class, racial and ethnic groups experience an equal opportunity to
 learn.
- Induction is reasoning that is done through the process of inferring a general law or principle from the observation of particular instances to a general conclusion.
- Deduction is reasoning through a process which is the reverse of induction that is
 from a general principle to particulars included within the scope of that principle.
- Dialectic is a means of discovering the truth by proceeding from an assertion or thesis to a denial or antithesis and finally reconciling the two into synthesis.
- Human Act proceeds from the deliberate free will of man.
- Acts of Man are acts that do not proceed from the deliberate free will of man.
 These are sometimes instinctive.
